# FAQs

### Where did the idea for Spermicide come from?

Spermicide was born out of co-creator Cat Davis' journey to make a gaybie. She and her wife considered numerous close friends and family members as sperm donors. After nearly running one of them down in their Prius, they decided it might be smartest to go anonymous. Fortunately, they got a wonderful baby girl and a great idea for a short for their troubles.

### How did the creative team come together?

Cat & Scott have been making art together for over two decades since they started creating offbeat musical theater as undergraduates at Yale, alongside fellow *Spermicide* cast member Thomas. The three lead roles were written specifically for the performers, bringing longtime friend and rising star Kimia into their troupe.

### Why Spermicide?

In an era where bodily autonomy and Queer rights are increasingly under attack, the filmmakers felt the need to create a work that addresses the challenges of making a baby in a same-sex marriage in the only way they know how – with gross out humor, tons of gore, and just the right amount of heartfelt emotion.

### Where was Spermicide filmed?

Spermicide was filmed on location in Burbank, Pasadena, and Atwater Village in greater Los Angeles, CA (Eastside is the Best Side!).


### What was the process of making Spermicide?




